Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back everyone! I hope that you all had an enjoyable half term break. Term 6 has got off to a flying start with lots of fabulous learning taking place across the school.

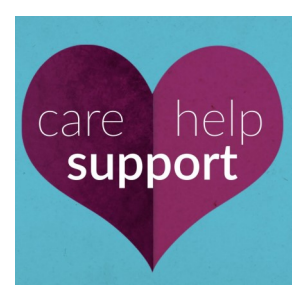

Parents and children in Year 5 considering taking the Kent Test should be aware that the application window is now open. It will remain so until the deadline of 23:59 on Monday 1 July.

Anyone who has a question about the administration and taking of the assessment should contact Kent County Council directly through their Education Helpline on 03000 41 21 21 (Option 1). The school are unable to answer your questions about the optional test, which is a KCC run assessment to determine the suitability or otherwise for a Grammar School education at Key Stage 3 and 4.

### Thankyou to our Volunteers!

This week is National Volunteers' Week, where we join companies and organisations across the UK; recognising, celebrating and giving great thanks to our incredible volunteers for all they contribute to local communities, the voluntary sector, and society as a whole.

Here we are blessed with so many parents, carers and friends of the school who perform numerous roles that fully enrich the lives and experiences of our children at Slade.

We have a team of 20 volunteer readers who come in every week to hear children read; this has enabled over 100 more children to read and show understanding of a text to an adult than would have otherwise been the case.

Our PTA raise thousands of pounds through their various fundraising events - every penny of which gets ploughed immediately back to buy resources for the school, most of which is used for years to come.

The PTA don't just raise money - they have recently run their special Book Café for the younger years, where each child has been able to learn about the function of a library and how to easily find different genres of books, before taking home a book of their choice.

Speaking of the Library, we also welcome in parent volunteers to run the library sessions each lunchtime - allowing the children to visit this incredibly valuable area whenever they want to. The volunteers also help with the upkeep of the area, keeping it functional, tidy and easy to use for the children.

Every school trip and visit also requires the help of parents who volunteer their time to make the event safe and enjoyable for the children. Without their assistance, we would not be able to run these trips which provide so many memories for the children.

This is also the same for all of the varied and numerous sporting events that we now take part in - acting as coaches (both the sporting and transport kind!), supporters, and chaperones - again, we would not be able to offer the rich and varied selection of activities without this help.

Furthermore, we are grateful to the parents who have this year begun to assist brilliantly with our Forest School sessions - working alongside Tina Hall in our outside space for every child to enjoy a different kind of learning experience.

### Mrs Luffingham Meets Captain Lantus!

Last weekend, Mrs Luffingham was invited to speak at a national conference in Liverpool about living with Type 1 diabetes.

Type 1 diabetes is a life threatening disease where the body's immune system destroys the insulin making cells in the pancreas. Without insulin, your body ceases to function and you can't live without insulin injections or using an insulin pump.

There is nothing you can do to prevent developing Type 1 diabetes. There is currently no cure. Whilst at the conference, Mrs Luffingham met Max, a young boy who has had Type 1 since he was 18 months old.

Max and his father have written several heart-warming books using a superhero character, Captain Lantus, to inspire and uplift young children facing life with Type 1 diabetes and they kindly donated two books for our own school library.

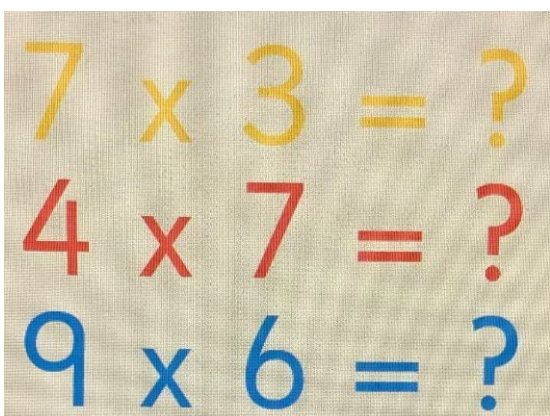
### Assessment Week in Year 1 and 4

The Year 4 classes have been preparing for their multiplication screening this week; with the actual assessments now due to take place next week. The delay to the taking of the test is due to making sure that all of the children feel comfortable showing us their times tables knowledge at a time when they are with the familiar face of Mr Clark, who will be taking Phoenix Class through their last term this year.

Also next week, our Year 1 children in Pixie and Elf Classes will be taking part in their Year 1 statutory Phonics Screening Check. All Year 1 pupils in England take the phonics screening check which will be carried out by class teachers in a one to one setting.

The check is made up of 40 words, and usually lasts 5 to 10 minutes. Some words are real words and others are nonsense, or 'alien', words that help to show if pupils can work out how to decode words they haven't seen before. The aim of the check is to help us to see how pupils are progressing in phonics and to identify where additional teaching and support may be required.

To show that fantastic dancing and performing runs in their family, Harriet's older sister, Emilia, was also at the show, In the same dance section. Emmy - dancing alongside fellow Year 5 friend Izzy and from Year 6, Liliana. Their number, Trip a Little Light, came second in the section and gained a place in the All England Dance National Finals in Wolverhampton this summer.

Everyone at Slade is incredibly proud of the girls, who all dance with local dance outfit, Associates.

We were lucky to catch a word with Harriet this week, who told us about her experience on the stage in Crawley, 'We started planning our dance two years ago, we have practised and rehearsed it and performed it over that time - it started as a very basic dance, and as time has gone on and we have become stronger and better dancers, we have adapted it and made it more complex and a far better dance to watch. It is character dancing, with a mix of modern and ballet and I get to move right around the stage.

The first time we danced in the local round of the All England competition I was very nervous, but now I love getting on to the stage - the one in Crawley for the Regional finals was the largest I had ever danced on and it was a lot of fun. We were disappointed not to go through to the national finals - we received a score of 23.7, when you had to get 24! However, I am not worried as we will be back with another fantastic dance next time, and I get to watch Emmy, Izzy and Liliana performing at the finals in Wolverhampton in the summer!'

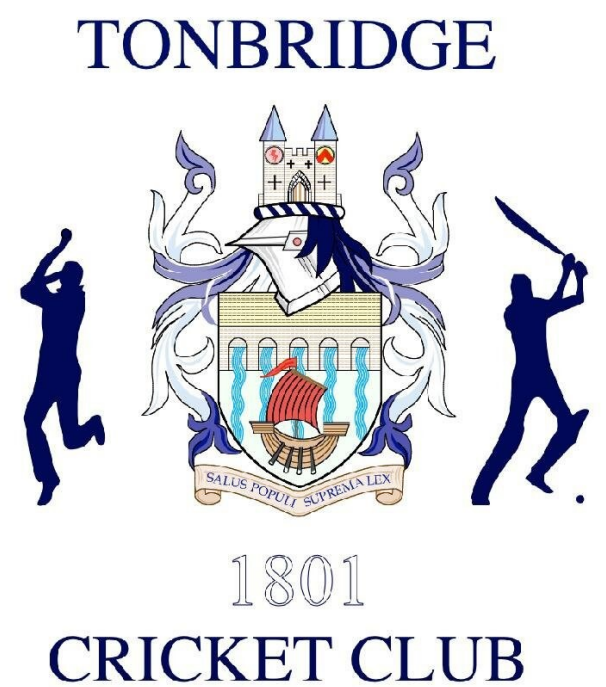
### Dynamos Cricket: Tonbridge Cricket Club

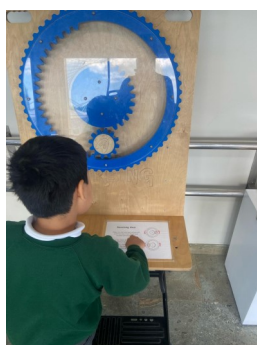
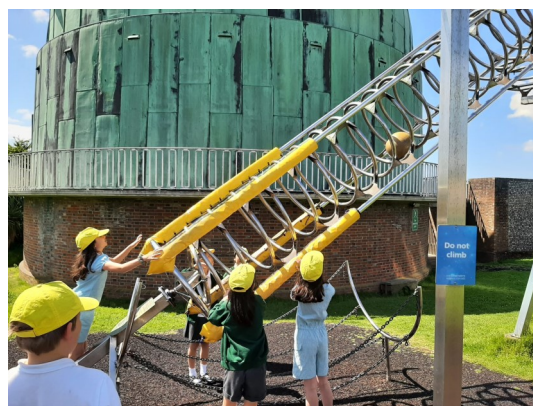

For the Fête, we're looking for a few more BBQ volunteers for cooking and serving; if you can help please let us know and if you've got a preference on which role you do, let us know that as well.

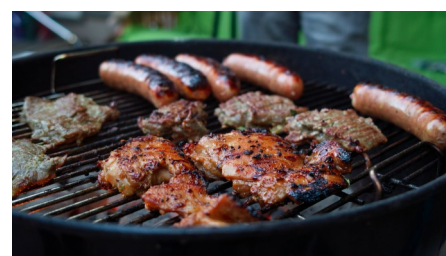

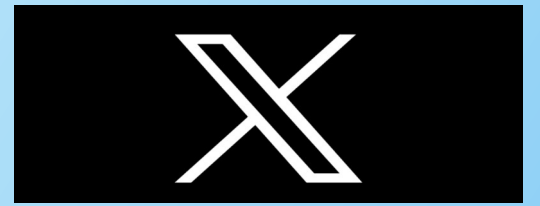

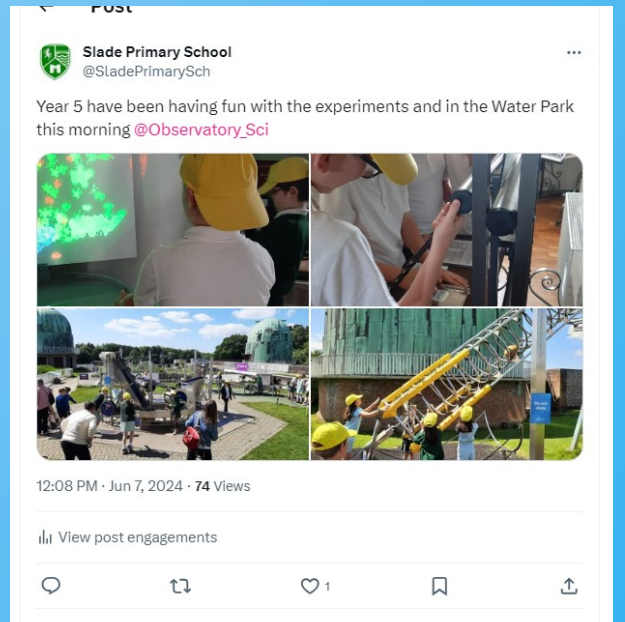
