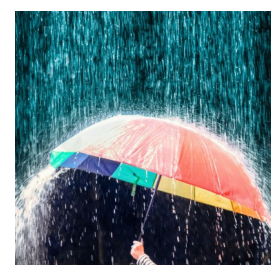
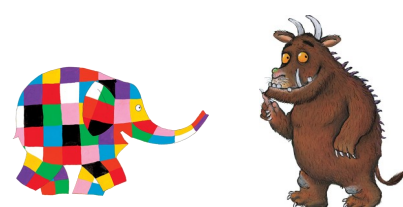

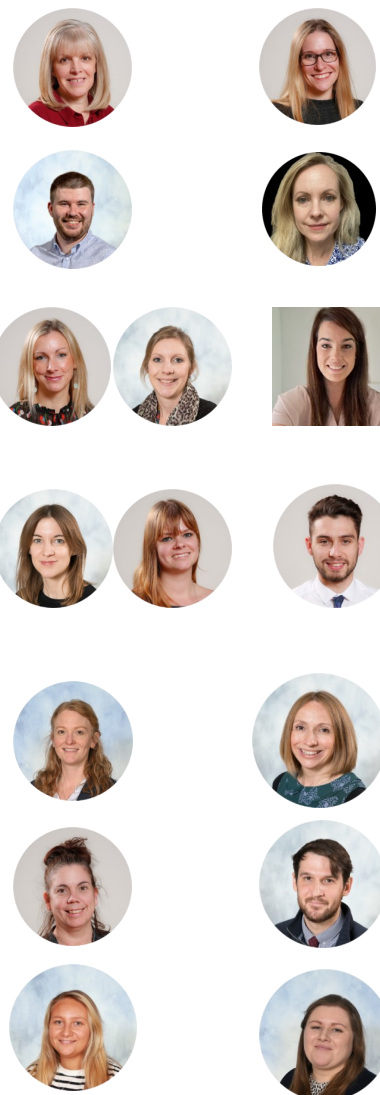

A great day all round - thankyou to everyone involved from both Tonbridge School and their Community Teams as well as everyone who helped to organise the activities here at Slade.



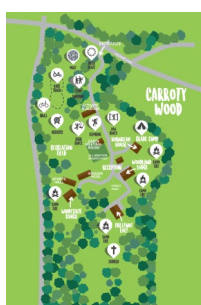
Waterlogged HillFest Cancelled

FOCUS ON YEAR 2



Wet, but Wonderful in Maidstone!

On Tuesday, our Year 2 classes travelled the short distance to a drizzly, but enthralling Kent Life in Maidstone for their Educational Visit that concentrated on two topics; Where our Food Comes From and in History, the Victorian era in the UK.

Victorian Schooldays: The Verdict

The children already know how lucky they have been this year, being paired in Gnome Class with Mrs Potter and Mrs Hill in Sprite Class, however they are today more sure than ever that being at primary school in Kent in 2024 is much more favourable than if they had been learning 150 or so years ago!

They were sat in the Victorian schoolroom at the popular attraction on the banks of the Medway to receive typical lessons in Maths, English and Reading from a strict school mistress called Miss Sergeant. Katie tells us more, 'She was horrible - I asked her when we would be getting playtime and she called me a Strange Girl! That was not very nice. The lesson was different to Mrs Potter's - we just had to chant out the alphabet and if we did not behave then we were told that we could be wacked on the bottom or on our fingers. Victorian school was not fun!'

Otis in Sprite Class agreed, 'the classroom was dark and only lit by small lanterns - I much prefer having Mrs Hill as my teacher. I was told to wear the hat with a 'D' on it. This means I was the dunce and everybody laughed. I know we were only joking, but I understand why children in the Victorian school would feel sad, angry and even embarrassed by having to wear it.'



Fresh Food and Farm to Fork

Recently, the Year 2 children have been learning about healthy eating and where the food that ends up on the supermarket shelves and on to their plates comes from.

Kent Life was therefore the perfect place to find out!

We visited the herb gardens, the fruit trees and the vegetable patches to see how the different fresh foods grow. Katie was particularly impressed with the lettuce, she had more than one sample to savour!

The children were also given a talk on how animals are reared for food and described how one could in fact live at the living museum as they had all of the fresh food growing successfully as well as pigs, lambs and goats that can be used for food - they also found out that animals are used in the making of many popular products, such as sweets that contain gelatine.



A Ride Round for Tired Legs!

One of the favourite activities at Kent Life for any visitor is a tractor ride around the park. Gnome and Pixie Classes were lucky enough to be able to jump on board and see all of the attractions that they had visited during the day from the comfort of a carriage seat!

Slade Elects

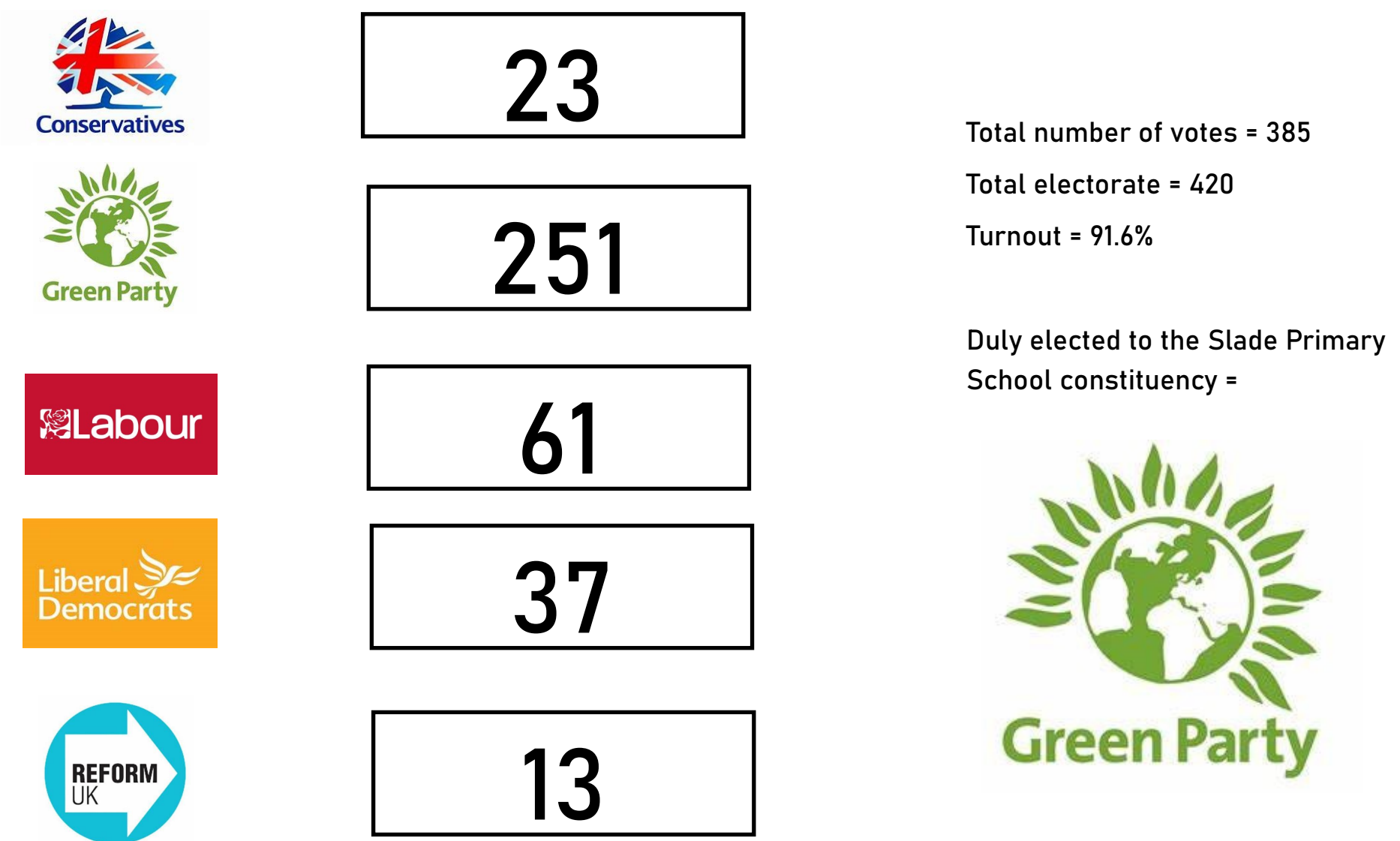
The General Election provokes many emotions - from lively debates to thoughtful conversations and thoughts about the current state of the nation and where each individual wishes it to go next.

Voting in our democracy is a right that we must never take for granted and therefore it is vital to provide children and young adults not yet old enough to vote an understanding of why we vote in different elections from local parish elections, local council, County Council and of course General Elections such as the one that happened on Thursday.

In school, It is also important that children hear or see what the politicians have to say and are given the opportunity to make their own minds up on what they think. This was done expertly by our Year 6 children who presented age related assemblies to each yeargroup at the beginning of the week before explaining how voting happens - why it is a secret ballot and how one of the candidates who have put themselves up for election becomes the winner.

Even though the vote at Slade was just for fun and intended to give the children an experience of what it is like to think about the pros and cons of all of the candidates before making their final decision - they all listened intently and were very serious about where their vote would go.

Violet from Griffin Class was the official Returning Officer and she read out the results, which were as follows in alphabetical order (the children voted for parties rather than an individual name):

Record Breakers

Lochie in Year 3 was one of a team of local record breakers, which also included his big brother Xavier, in Tonbridge last weekend. We are very pleased to share his story of a Tug o' War record attempt which involved hundreds of competitors and a rope 540m long!

Lochie spoke with Mrs Shafer during yesterday's transition events:

"I did a Guinness World Record for the longest rope and the most number of people pulling at the same time.

It was in the park, where Tonbridge Juniors is. It was a bit cloudy but there were loads of people.

I had to hold onto a real rope and pull really hard, but there were rules to follow: I wasn't allowed to tuck the rope under my arm and I wasn't allowed to wrap it around my hand. I got to go because I really wanted to take part in a real Guinness World Record and if you take part you get a reward for taking part in the challenge.

I have to wait to get the reward - they have to prove that it was a real world record before I get it. I was very happy because I got to take part in my first world record in my entire life. I'd like to do more world records - maybe I could do a world record involving football."

We can't wait to hear the result of the record breaking attempt and congratulate Lochie and everyone else involved at the Racecourse last week. We also know that Lochie loves his football, so watch out for his name next to another record soon.

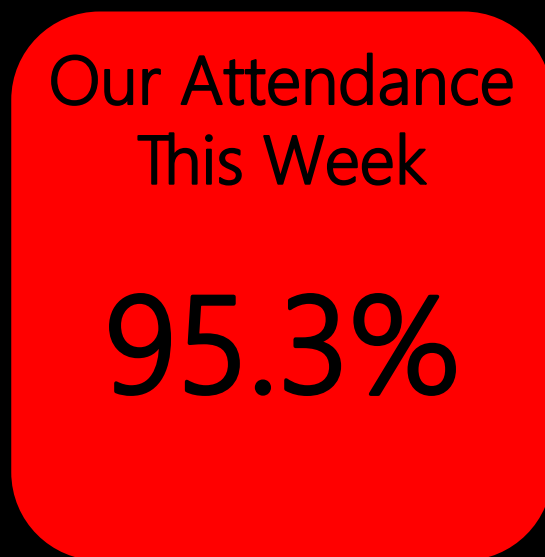
Over a school year, we are due to be open for 190 days which equates to 380 sessions.

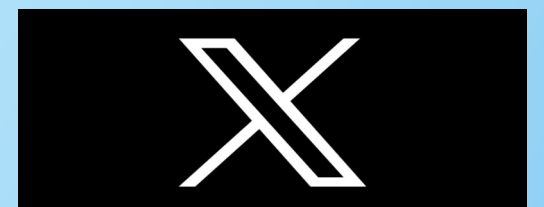
