Dear Parents and Families,

It has been a pleasure to reconnect with so many of you either at the school gate over the past two weeks or during the recent 'Meet the Team' meetings. If we haven't had the chance to speak yet, I do hope you and your family enjoyed a restful summer break and are feeling refreshed for the year ahead.

I would especially like to extend a warm welcome to our new Reception children and their families, who joined us at the beginning of this week. It has been a joy to watch them begin to build friendships, explore their classrooms and grow in confidence as they settle into their new environment. Alex has been a dedicated member of the team for nearly nine years and was not only a fantastic ambassador for our HI pupils but has made a positive difference to so many children that she has worked with and supported over the years. Alex was also a dedicated part of our safeguarding team here at Slade as well as being one of our Mental Health Ambassadors. Alex will be greatly missed, but we're pleased to share that she will be returning in a few weeks' time so we can all say a proper goodbye and thank her for her many contributions to Slade.

Finally, a huge well done to our Year 6 pupils that sat the Kent Test yesterday! I am extremely proud of all of them and was particularly impressed with how each of them approached the papers with confidence and maturity. I'm sure there is a sigh of relief for parents and children alike now that this stage is over!

## DEMOCRACY AT SLADE

Next week, we will be holding our annual elections across the school as we seek to form a new Pupil Council and House Captain group.

During the week, each teacher in Year 1-6 will ask their class if anyone would like to stand for Pupil Council; the elected body that meets once a term to discuss activities, events and items of interest at school. The children who would like to be considered will present a short talk to their classmates before a blind vote takes place - the two children from each class who receive the most votes will be asked to join the council as representatives of their class. Meetings usually take place at lunchtimes.

Then on Friday, the Year 6 children who have put their names forward to be considered to be House Captains will give a presentation to all of the children in their house group who will then decide who to vote for by visiting our polling station and casting their votes just like we all do in local, county and general elections.

The results of the elections will be announced in the school newsletter in the coming weeks, with best of luck to everyone who puts their name forward.

Details on how to order and purchase your child's photograph will be published in our newsletter on Friday 3 October.


## AN EVENING WITH MICHAEL ROSEN

**RE: Proposed development at Slade Primary School, The Slade, Tonbridge, TN91HR**

We are writing to inform you about a planned improvement project at Slade Primary School, located at The Slade, Tonbridge, TN9 1HR.

Kent County Council Infrastructure Division is applying to Kent County Council Planning Applications Group for planning permission for the replacement of an old mobile classroom unit that is no longer fit for purpose due to its age and condition with a modern, purpose-built modular building. This new facility would serve as a single classroom space that would also be accessible for wheelchair users.

The project is in the early stages and subject to planning approval and as such, a definitive timeline is not yet set. We will share further details and timelines once they are confirmed, and the necessary approvals are in place.
