## CENSUS DAY FISH AND CHIPS

Emma's Kitchen had a bumper day yesterday as they served up a hot meal to 334 children across the school, including 171 (96.7%) in EYFS and Key Stage 1 classes.

Thursday was national schools census day, the day when the Government take a snap shot of various aspects of school life. This includes the take up of school meals in EYFS, Key Stage 1 pupils and those eligible for benefits related Free School Meals in all yeargroups.

The number of meals eaten affects the plans central government have for school budgets, at a time when budgets are as stretched as they have ever been, we are pleased to have submitted such positive figures to the census.

We hope that any child trying school meals for the first time enjoyed the new fresh taste provided by Emma and Alex and all of the team at Emma's Kitchen.

## PARENT GOVERNOR APPLICATIONS

The deadline to put your name forward for one of our two parent governor positions is just short of a week away.

Applications must be submitted by midday on Friday 10 October.

Together with the headteacher, the Governing Body has overall responsibility for the running of the school; amongst many duties governors are involved in deciding school policies, allocating the school's budget and appointing senior staff.

The core functions of the Governing Body include, but are not limited to ensuring:

- that the vision, ethos and strategic direction of the school are clearly defined
- that the headteacher performs their responsibilities for the educational performance of the school
- the sound, proper and effective use of the school's financial resources

No special qualifications are needed, the most important thing is to have a keen interest in the school and be prepared to give time to play an active part in the Governing Body's work. In order to support governors in their work full training is provided at no cost to the individual.

In our school we have three parent governors who serve for a term of office of 4 years. The full Governing Body normally meets once a term, on a Wednesday at 6.30pm. In addition, there may be committee meetings held each term, specific arrangements will depend on the model of governance adopted by the Governing Body. Governors are required to have Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) and Section 128 checks – which must be started within 21 days of appointment/election.

The application form which includes space for a 250 word personal statement was attached to Miss Garrett's invitation to apply sent last Friday. ## SHINING AT SLADE

Last year we were lucky enough to have Sandra Hepple, a Kent Cricket professional come in and deliver cricket coaching sessions free of charge to your children. These sessions were made possible by the charity Chance to Shine. Chance to Shine ([www.chancetoshine.org](http://www.chancetoshine.org)) is a national charity that helps children and young people play, learn and develop through cricket, supported by the English Cricket Board.

In 2025, Chance to Shine celebrates 20 years of delivering cricket in schools and communities across the country. Through their anniversary campaign, Inspired by Cricket, they are shining a light on the people, the stories, and the passion that fuel their mission. We are very proud to say that Slade Primary School was chosen to share our children's cricket journey as part of this campaign.

At the beginning of the week, Sandra visited Slade with colleagues from their media team to film our cricketers for their website and e-Learning platform, as a bit of a case study, filming some coaching sessions and speaking to some of the teachers and pupils who took part.

'Playing cricket is really good fun, my favourite part is batting. Sandra's coaching has helped me improve as a player as we play rapid cricket a lot with her, which helps me get better at the faster version of the game, which will make my reactions quicker when I play proper cricket.'

## INSPIRED BY THE RED ROSES

It has been quite the five or six weeks for the sport of rugby as The Women's World Cup landed on our shores, taking the competition right across the country from the Stadium of Light and the York Community Stadium in the North East to Ashton Gate and Sandy Park in the South West and plenty of places in between before the final held at the capital of England Rugby last weekend which saw the home nation win the cup and the title of World Champions in a thrilling encounter with Canada.



There have been children at Slade who have been using the inspiration provided by the Red Roses and their competitors by learning and playing rugby in a series of sessions laid on by our neighbours at Tonbridge Juddians RFC.

Last week, a team of Year 3 and 4 children made the short journey to Juddians where they learnt skills and had the opportunity to play.

Matilda told us what they got up to, 'There were lots of schools who all came to take part. The coaches all wore red jackets and told us the rules of the game. We then played matches, but when something happened that we could improve on or we could learn the coach would blow his whistle and we would all stop where we were and he explained what we could do. This helped to improve our rugby skills. It was very enjoyable and we all received a Juddians Rugby Club medal!'
