SECONDARY SCHOOL APPLICATION DEADLINE

All parents and carers of children in Year 6 are reminded that the deadline for submitting your application for secondary school is at 23:59 on Friday 31 October.

Monday 2 March 2026: National Secondary Offer Day (parents will be informed of the allocation via the email address used to make the application).

Monday 16 March 2026: Deadline for accepting or refusing offers. These decisions should be communicated to the allocated school directly. Full details will appear in your offer pack.

NHS FLU CLINICS

We are very grateful to Nurses Ailyn, Laura, Kami and Kayleigh for visiting us on Wednesday to administer the flu immunisations to the children at Slade. In the end they were pleased to be able to vaccinate 70% of our children.

Kent Community Health have the following message for parents of children who would still like to have the vaccination against flu this winter but were unable to have it this week in school, and for parents of children who did receive the nasal spray this week as they seek feedback about the service.



Tia from Kent Community Health Immunisation Service says,

'The Immunisation Service would like to invite parents to book an appointment at one of their community clinics if your child missed the Flu vaccination during the recent school visit.

If you gave consent but your child was not immunised, you will have received an automated email with a link to book an appointment.

Alternatively, if you missed the opportunity for your child to be vaccination at the school session you can still complete a consent form via our website at <https://www.kentimmunisations.co.uk/> using the school code: KT118285.

There is a particular way that the votes must be submitted to us, please take note of this to make sure that your vote counts.

- Ballot (Voting) Papers need to be returned in a sealed, inner, unmarked envelope
- The sealed, unmarked envelope should be placed in a second, outer envelope
- The second, outer envelope should be marked with:
 - ◊ Parent Governor Election
 - ◊ Your Name and Address
 - ◊ The names of your children
 - ◊ You should then also sign across the seal of the envelope

GIVING MEDICINE IN SCHOOL

We are always pleased to help parents in administering prescribed medicine at school where directed by a Doctor or Pharmacist.

This is usually a dose of antibiotics, pain medicine or eye drops that needs to be administered at different times of the day, including school time.

To quicken the system up and to free space in our smaller than average reception area, we have introduced an online form which parents and carers should complete before bringing the medicine to school. If this has not been completed before, we will have a way of completing the form in school online, although this will take up more of your time.

The form can be accessed on our school website under the Parents heading and choosing the first option: Administration of Medicines at School or by using this link:

You are reminded that medicines should be delivered to school by an adult and not left in a child's bag - they must also be collected by an adult each evening if necessary.

At the end of the dose, we will; contact you to ask that the empty bottle is collected as this should be disposed of in the correct way.

We have also introduced a system where we will send you an email each time we administer the medicine so you can be sure that your child has received their medicine and you will be able to tell when their next dose can be.

The deadline for free delivery to school following your order of your child's individual and/or sibling photograph runs out on Sunday 19 October.

Two - Baroness Floella Benjamin and Malorie Blackman - are part of the current generation; Betty Campbell and Laurie Cunningham belong to the period 'within living memory'; while Olaudah Equiano and Mary Seacole are figures from the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries respectively. They have also been chosen to offer a broad range of occupations and achievements.

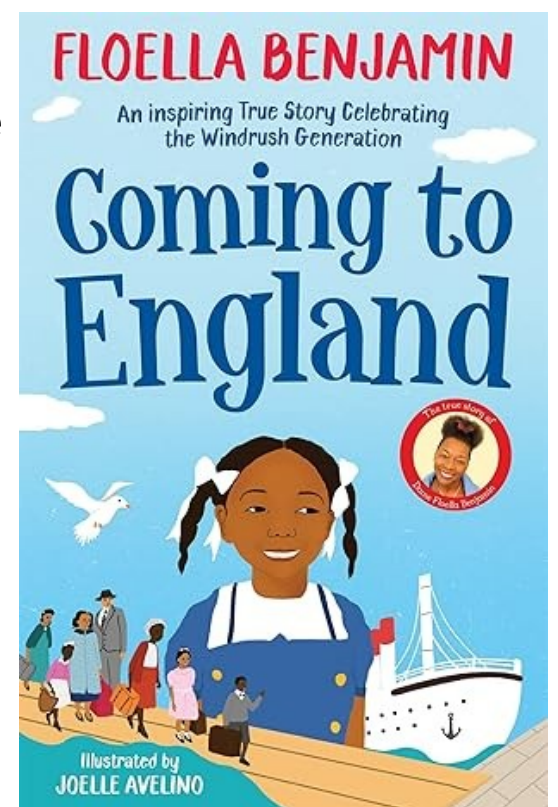
For pupils in Key Stage 2, BBC have a collection of short films which explore the experiences and contributions of people from communities across the UK, and celebrating the rich contribution of the black community to the culture, society and economy of the UK.

They speak to members of the community who have gone on to perform jobs as diverse as being a coal miner, a nurse in the NHS, a children's author, a professional photographer, an architect, a farmer, working in the fashion industry, a poet and even becoming the Lord Mayor of Sheffield.

There is also a special video with 13-year-old Amelia and Vernon Samuels, who represented Great Britain in the 1988 Olympics, who tell the story of the 1963 Bristol Bus Boycott and Vernon's father, who was the first black bus driver in Bristol.
