Dear Parents and Families,

It has been another busy and exciting week in school, with so much wonderful learning taking place across all our classes. Members of the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) regularly visit classrooms to see the learning in action and this week I particularly enjoyed spending time in the lower end of the school. I also had the opportunity to visit more classes as part of my story time sessions with both EYFS classes, as well as with Elf Class just before lunchtime today!

On Wednesday, we held our second Open Morning and was also the deadline for parents and carers to cast their votes for who they would like to represent the parent community on the Governing Body. We were delighted by the high level of participation, with a total of 173 votes cast, 133 counted in line with the required procedures. I am pleased to announce that the two candidates receiving the most votes are James Gritten and Helen Vincent. Congratulations to you both! I look forward to working with you in your new roles as School Governors and seeing you at our next Full Governing Body (FGB) meeting on Wednesday 26th November.

Your willingness to support the school in this way is greatly appreciated and demonstrates the strong sense of community we share. Please remember there are always other opportunities to get involved in school life through our PTA or through one of our volunteer roles as either a Reading Angel or support in Forest School. We have also welcomed two new members of staff to our team this week. On Monday, Lisa Whiley joined our Titans team as an experienced Teaching Assistant, following the departure of Alex Taylor. Lisa will be supporting some of our hearing-impaired children as well as others across the school. On Thursday, we were pleased to welcome Eleanor Manktelow-Santer to our Yetis After School Club team. For those whose children attend our Wraparound Care, Eleanor will be supporting on Thursdays and Fridays after school.

Looking ahead to next week, we will be taking time to reflect on Armistice Day and at the end of the week, we will be supporting the BBC Children in Need appeal. Children are invited to leave their uniform at home and wear their own clothes to school, should they wish, and to make a small monetary donation to this very worthy cause. A big thank you to our newly elected Pupil Council, who have helped to organise this event for everyone across the school.

2026 PRIMARY APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN

Today, Kent County Council opened the application window for parents of children born between 1 September 2021 and 31 August 2022 to apply for their preferred primary school setting from September 2026.

The application window remains open until Thursday 15 January 2026 with the allocations emailed to parents on National Offer Day on Thursday 16 April 2026.

It was fantastic to welcome to Slade this Wednesday, another 90 parents and carers who are considering their choices at present and we thank them for coming along to hear and see a typical morning at school.

Our last open event still has places available if you are, or know someone who is in the position of making a primary school application this year. That event will be held on Wednesday 19 November from 09:15 - bookings can be made here:

Parents of children already in primary school are reminded that they still need to apply in the same way. Sibling links are valid if:

- One older sibling is currently in EYFS, Year 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 at the chosen school
- That the family have not moved home a distance greater than 2 miles since their last application

This week, Miss Garrett has been delighted to have spent time in Yeti's, becoming a honorary Breakfast Clubber and seeing some of the new look improvements that she is overseeing at our morning wraparound provision.

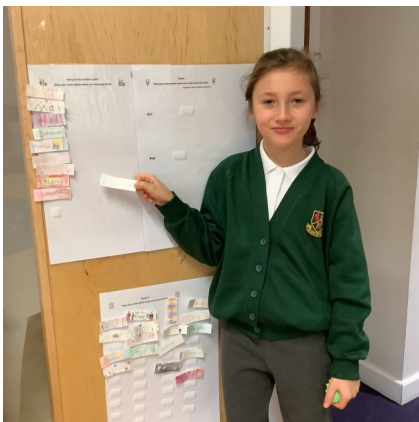
The small but important changes, introduced to the children attending Breakfast Club over the last week, include a self registration, a wider range of things to do and also a brand new outside area packed full of new games and activities.

This week, we spoke to Breakfast Club Playworker Louise Pearson who explained the benefits of these improvements:

'We are really pleased with these improvements as they allow for children to be a bit more free flow in their choice of activities and how they spend their time preparing for their day of learning in school. From the independence of managing their registration and where they will be by moving their name card to the appropriate place on our posters, which also aligns with the process in most of the classrooms, they have the chance to spend time outside with the range of new activities to try - the favourite being our curling set - it will not be long before we host our first curling competition as they have taken to it so well! The outside zone is available from 7:30 to 8:30 initially for ten children at a time, but we do make sure that the children have eaten their breakfast before going outside. To further enhance the area we are looking to purchase a covered sandpit and a small trampette - if you know anyone who has something like this that may be looking to let them go, do point them in our direction!'

The school is incredibly grateful to everyone who voted in the Parent Governor election, the votes of which were counted on Thursday night by current Governor Scott Miller and PA to the Senior Leadership Team Amanda Parsons, overseen by Headteacher and Returning Officer Viki Garrett.

The level of engagement for this election was much higher than we have seen in previous elections with 173 voting papers returned, showing the level of commitment and support our parent and carer community have towards Slade and we thank you all. Our thanks is extended especially to all of the candidates who put themselves forward for election, to have so many of willing to serve as a school governor is also a testament to your support for the school. Your strong election statements will have driven the large number of votes made, so thank you very much.

Many congratulations to our two new Parent Governors, James Gritten and Helen Vincent who were duly elected, we look forward to working with you for the benefit of the whole school now and in the future.

POPPY APPEAL

This week, several teams of Year 6 children have been traveling the school each morning raising money for the annual Poppy Appeal by the Royal British Legion.

The Poppy Appeal helps the RBL to provide lifelong support to serving and ex serving personnel and their families. Last year, the RBL responded to 128,268 requests for support - 351 for every day of the year.

Funds raised through the annual appeal saw last year 22,000 people receiving welfare support, £1.4million raised in food and clothing grants to the Armed Forces community who could not afford the basic essentials, 781 residents staying in RBL care homes receiving support to stay independent and 1548 new families living with dementia supported by the RBL Admiral Nurse service.

The sale of poppy merchandise will continue until Armistice Day (11 November) or until stocks run out if before.



To help raise awareness of Armistice Day and of conflict in World War 1 and World War 2, Librarian Hannah Mills has updated her book display in the school lobby area. Books include fiction texts of stories based in the war such as Michelle Magorian's classic Goodnight Mr Tom and Wave Me Goodbye by Jacqueline Wilson and non fiction text giving information about those wars. Including Home in the Blitz a look at how people adapted their homes and communities during the fiercest times of WW2, Poppy Day which describes the origins of why a poppy is used to signify Armistice and remembrance and also a special book, A Schoolgirl's War by Mary Smith, former Head Teacher at Maidstone Grammar School for Girls. The book explores life at the school during World War 2. Mary shares her extensive research as well as beautiful drawings and paintings by Helen Keen, an art teacher at MGGs during the war that vividly captured the experiences of students and staff during this turbulent period.

CHILDREN IN NEED NON UNIFORM DAY

The Pupil Council met at the end of Term 1 to discuss ideas for the upcoming Children in Need Day. To be able to include every child at Slade, they decided on a Non Uniform Day, which will be held next Friday, 14 November.

ON THE HUNT FOR LIFE WITH YEAR 2

Sprite Class went for a trawl around the school grounds on Wednesday afternoon as they took part in an outside science lesson, exploring the natural environment around them. They went on the hunt for things that fell in to the categories:

- Those that are alive
- Those that are no longer alive
- Those that have never been alive



Alisha and Anya were able to tell us the difference between these categories and that it was sometimes difficult to decide if something had never been alive or if it was no longer alive.

They discussed their thoughts before committing their ideas to paper before returning back to the classroom to discuss what they had found.



Henry and Henry had been very busy by the time we caught up with them, deciding that leaves were a tricky item - some were alive on the trees, others used to be alive when they were crinkly and on the ground. They also identified that there are lots of items that have never been alive such as rocks, pipes made from plastic, wire and glass being among them.

Can you look around on your way home to see if you can do your own science investigation with the things you see around you?

RSBP PRIMARY PHOTOGRAPHY AND ART COMPETITION

RSBP are the bird and wildlife conservation charity and the Tonbridge RSPB local group are celebrating their 50th anniversary this year and they are celebrating by holding a primary school photography and art competition for 4-11 year olds from Tonbridge, Paddock Wood and Tunbridge Wells. They have been speaking to Forest School Leader, Tina Hall:

‘Do you love Nature? We do! We’d love you to show us how much you love Nature by sending us a photograph of something or somewhere in the natural world that you’ve seen and thought “I love that!”

It could be big or small, wild plants or bugs or a fox or a frosty spider’s web or a special place like an autumn wood … or anything!

There’s so much nature and wildlife to look for and celebrate all around us, in our towns and cities, on our nature reserves and green spaces, or even in your own garden!’

There are two categories: Photography and Art. The theme is ‘The Nature I Love’

Entries will be divided into three Primary School year groups:

- Osprey: Years 6 and 5
- Peregrine: Years 4 and 3
- Kestrel: Years 2, 1 and Reception (Year 0)

Artwork entrants are especially encouraged to work from direct observation (real life) rather than from a photograph or the internet. The judges will look more favourably upon such submissions
