Dear Parents and Families,

## PUTTING ON A SHOW: IMPORTANT INFORMATION

We are looking forward to seeing those parents, carers and other relatives who have booked on to watch the Christmas performances this year. The rehearsals sound polished already and the children are eager to perform on the stage for you all!

A reminder to visitors that entry to the performances will be via the main playground gates, which will be opened ten minutes before the scheduled start time of the show. This means that the gates for morning performances will open at 09:20 and in the afternoon at 13:50. Visitors are asked to be mindful of other road and pathway users - please do not cause a hazard by blocking the pathway on the corner of Stafford Road and The Slade, or immediately outside of the gates themselves. We respectfully ask that you do not smoke or vape whilst waiting in the queue either.

Miss Garrett will remind all audience members that any videos and photographs taken at the shows that contain images of children other than their own are strictly for personal use only and should not be shared via any device or be put on to social media. ## SLADE'S YOUNG POETS

Calling Key Stage 2 children who enjoy writing and reading poetry - Mrs Burnside has some exciting news and opportunities for the many children at Slade who do!

The National Literacy Trust and National Poetry Centre have now opened applications for regional **Young Poet Laureates**. This programme provides children with new opportunities to explore and discover poetry in their schools and communities. The scheme will involve visiting local community events to share poetry and working with professional writers and mentors to develop their poetry skills.

We thought this would be the perfect opportunity to appoint our own **Poetry Champion at Slade**. Anyone who applies for the Young Poet Laureate will automatically be considered for this new role.

The Slade Poetry Champion will help spread the joy of poetry throughout the school with their own poetry, as well as poems by their favourite poets. To enter, children should write their very best poem. They also need to write a short statement explaining why they would make a good young poet laureate.

- o Both poem and an accompanying statement must be typed on the same Word document.

- o The supporting statement cannot exceed 200 words maximum.

- o The poem cannot exceed 40 lines maximum.

- o Poems must be the young poets' own original work.

- o Poems must have not been produced by AI.

- o Poems with joint authorship are not allowed.

- o Once submitted, poems cannot be edited or resubmitted.



### When do you need to do it?

- o Email your first draft entry to Mrs Burnside by **Friday 5 January 2026** for her to check over. [sphinx@slade.kent.sch.uk](mailto:sphinx@slade.kent.sch.uk)

- o Email your final draft (if Mrs Burnside has suggested any changes) by Monday 15th January 2026.

- o Mrs Burnside will submit your entries online by 19 January 2026.

### What happens next:

- Results of The Slade Poetry Champion will be shared commencing 9th February. The champion will get to work from Term 4.

- For the Young Poet Laureate, the shortlisted schools and young poets will be informed week commencing 16 March 2026.

- Shortlisted schools and young poets will be publicly announced on the Young Poet Laureate website week commencing 23 March 2026.

- Regional masterclasses and judging panels will be held between 20 April to 8 May 2026. Shortlisted young poets must be available to attend a masterclass in their region.

## FRIENDSHIP WEEK: THE POWER OF GOOD

This week at Slade, the children have used the phrase, 'The Power of Good' to explain the lessons they have learnt about being good friends as well as taking a look at what to do if someone is being bullied. They also had the chance to read our brand new child-friendly safeguarding policy amongst plenty of other activities put together by Mrs Potter.

Each child will now have a clear understanding that bullying is the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. Importantly, they also know that this applies both face to face or online. The teachers have also explained how to report anything they see in school.

**What is Safeguarding about?**

All of the adults around us think that our health, safety and welfare are very important. In our school, we respect everyone and help to protect their rights. We do our best to help everybody make good progress in their education. We are taught how to recognise risks in different situations and how to protect ourselves and stay safe.

**How will we try to protect each other?**

The adults try to provide a safe environment for us to learn in. We want to help to ensure that children remain safe, at home, school and everywhere in between. We think it is important for all children to know where to get help if they are worried or unhappy about something.

**Need to talk?**

The Designated Lead for Safeguarding is Mrs Stephens - this means that Mrs Stephens has the main responsibility for making sure children in our school are healthy, safe and happy.

If you need to talk - they will listen. You can talk to any adult within the school, but there are some staff who help Mrs Stephens to make sure we are safe and well cared for.
