EYFS AT THE FARM

On Tuesday, our EYFS Classes took part in their first educational visit together as they took the Hams Travel Dreamliner (we kid you not!) to Godstone Farm in Surrey.

When there, they had a wonderful time in the spring sunshine, building on their learning so far this year and still to come as they find out all about animals, birth, life and looking after each other.

The team at Godstone Farm were amazing all day and provided the children with talks on hygiene around the farm and how they care for the different animals - everyone found out that this was not as easy as they first thought!

Elmer and Gruffalo Classes then had the chance during the day to feed the animals around the farm. They found the hens and pigs and fed them the food that they were given by the farmers.

It was an extra special treat when they arrived at the sheep field, as they could actually feed the sheep from their hands; which both the children and the sheep loved!

Later, we all became farmers with a chance to use equipment that farmers use in their jobs including rakes and wheelbarrows. The children were tasked with moving the hay and the straw to the correct places which helped both the animals and the farmers at Godstone get ready for their evening.

A trip to the duck pond, where the ducks were fed and a walk around the famous Godstone Dino Trail completed the afternoon and the trip out.

With many thanks to the team at Godstone for making us so welcome, to Hams Travel for getting us there and back and especially to all of the parents and carers who accompanied us on the trip, without your invaluable help these visits cannot take place. Thankyou!



YEAR 6 BIKEABILITY

The first three groups of Year 6 cyclists took to the streets this week in taking and achieving their Level 1 and 2 Bikeability certificate and badge.

We are fortunate to have so many keen riders who are keen to learn more about safe cycling which will enable them to cycle to school and around town knowing the rules of the road so they can keep themselves and other road users and pedestrians safe whilst getting from A to Z!



On Monday, we saw Level 1 take place on the school playground under the stewardship of old friend Kate Thomson and her colleague Mandy Barker who was thrilled to say that the session with our groups was her first as a qualified Bikeability instructor. Stage 1 teaches the children basic control of the bicycle including an introduction to hand signals when turning, and what to expect out on the road. Kate and Mandy also go through simple bike maintenance to help the children know more about the machine they are riding.

Stage 2 happens in smaller groups over three days with the children learning road rules, the exact meaning of road signs and road markings and where and when to look, signal and manoeuvre safely and effectively to get where they are going. They are all now able to carefully and successfully know when to look round, where to be riding on the road and when to signal, as well as be able to cycle against traffic, being aware of hazards such as parked cars, pedestrians and a large number of dogs that were being walked when we followed Group 1A on their Level 2 day on Wednesday alongside regular instructor Yolanda and Tansy who is new to Slade this week!



Congratulations to the first 24 Year 6 pupils for achieving Level 1 and 2 of the Bikeability programme. We have another 24 taking the course between 16-19 March and we look forward to meeting the Bikeability team once again.

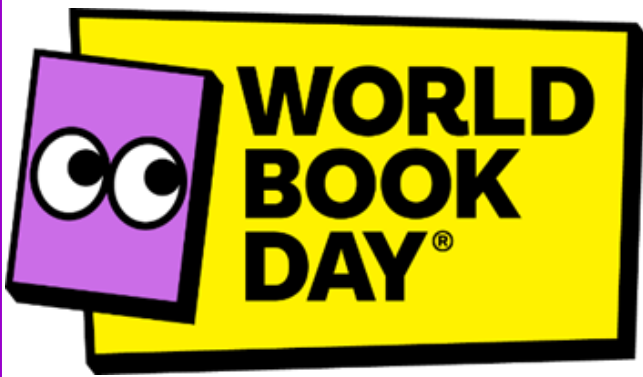

WORLD BOOK DAY: THURSDAY 5 MARCH



A reminder that next Thursday is World Book Day; Reading Leader Sarah Meers introduces the theme this year which is, 'If you're into it, read into it!'

Sarah says:

'We are excited to inform you that this year's World Book Day is taking place next week, on Thursday 5 March.

This year, the theme for World Book Day continues to focus on Reading for Pleasure and, throughout the day the children will have the opportunity to talk about their interests and understand how reading can help them to dive deeper into what they love.

The more we read into what excites us, the more engaged and confident we can become.

Among other things, the day will include:

- **Dressing up** – Children are encouraged to come to school dressed as their favourite character from a book or, if they would prefer, wearing pyjamas possibly with their favourite teddy bear. Please help your child to choose a costume they feel excited about.
- **Book Swap** – Children can bring in a pre-loved book to exchange with a classmate, giving them the chance to discover a new story. Please assist them to choose a book to swap.
