NEW BUILD UPDATE

Following last week's first update on our new building, the clearance work has continued at pace this week as Mr Humphrey has both demolished the existing sheds on the plot of the new build and also made sure that the contents of the sheds have been safely rehoused. Thankyou to all of the children for remembering our safety rules by keeping well clear of the barrier tape and the skip which has been filled, and refilled with the wood which made up the storage sheds and will be going away for recycling soon.



Hippogriff Class parents and carers have been getting used to their new collection arrangements this week and on Monday parents in Phoenix Class will see a slight change to their collection with a designated walkway which will lead you between Hippogriff Classroom and the building site.

The children have this week been learning about the building itself and the impact the construction will have in the short term. They may have shared with you at home that we will meet and greet the building team for the first time on Monday as they arrive to put up fences around the area that the building will be sited. The Easter holiday will see the noisier work completed by the team which will include digging into the ground and the various parts of the building will be brought on site. If you are passing school during the holiday, you may notice that the main gates change during this time to allow for these heavy plant deliveries to be made.

During the construction, which is expected to take the length of Term 5 up to the May Summer Terms Break, there will be builders on site most days as they complete the construction. The children have been taught and will be reminded about site safety and playtime and lunchtime routines will be adapted to help with this. Hopefully, the weather will remain dry which will allow for lunchtimes to be based on the school field as we always like to do at this time of year, with our new activity zones transferring to the larger area, with more fun to be had in the woodland areas and on the trim trail.

The plan is that the building will be completed for the beginning of Term 6; however we are mindful that delays can happen and we will keep you updated as work progresses.

The Pupil Council met yesterday as they have been invited to join the working group of staff and governors who are busy thinking of options for the naming of the new building. Mr Louth introduced this to them at their meeting yesterday afternoon with the request that they think about possible ideas including names of local importance or something directly related to Slade Primary School which would be a suitable and fitting name for a building that will be with us for a very long time. They will be canvassing opinion from the rest of their class and will bring the ideas back to Council shortly. Those ideas will then be shortlisted and put in with ideas from elsewhere around the school community.

Our Safeguarding Focus of the Week is Gaming

Many of our pupils enjoy playing video games, and for most children it can be a fun, social activity. However, it's important that families are aware of age ratings, in-game communication and the types of content children may be exposed to.

Understanding PEGI Ratings

Video games in the UK are rated by PEGI (Pan-European Game Information). These ratings help parents choose age-appropriate content:

- **PEGI 3** – Suitable for all ages. May contain very mild cartoon violence.
- **PEGI 7** – Some scenes or sounds may be frightening; mild violence possible.
- **PEGI 12** – Mild bad language, violence or sexual references.
- **PEGI 16** – More realistic violence or adult themes.
- **PEGI 18** – Explicit violence, strong language or content not suitable for children

Commonly Played Games (and Things to Consider)



Fortnite (PEGI 12): Cartoon-style shooting game with online chat. Children may encounter strangers, inappropriate language, or pressure to make in-game purchases.



Minecraft (PEGI 7): Creative and educational potential, but online multiplayer can expose children to unfiltered chat or unsuitable worlds if privacy settings aren't used.



Roblox (PEGI 7): Huge variety of user-generated games. Some user-created content may be frightening or inappropriate; in-game chat can put children in contact with unknown players.



FIFA (PEGI 3): Very popular sports game. Be aware of online chat and spending on "FUT packs" (loot boxes).



Call of Duty / GTA (PEGI 18): These games contain graphic violence, adult themes and explicit language. They are not suitable for primary school-aged children.

Top Tips for Safe Gaming at Home

- Set **PEGI-appropriate limits** on the games your child can access.
- Use **parental controls** on consoles and devices to manage play time, chat features and spending.
- Encourage gaming in **shared family spaces**, not bedrooms.
- Talk to your child about **who they play with** and what to do if something online makes them uncomfortable.

Remind children **never to share personal information** with anyone online.

'I love going to Weald Gymnastics Club where my favourite action is on the bar, but we don't do that in competitions. Today was special because my friend Daisy was in our team and it was her first time competing in gymnastics - she was brilliant; we both were awarded 9.9 out of 10 for our routines, which was amazing!'

Slade were represented by teams in both the Beginners section and the Advanced competition. Our beginners finished in 2nd place overall with the advanced team in 3rd place in their event. A superb effort and afternoon by everyone. Thankyou especially to all of the parents who travelled to the Angel Centre with the children and supported them from the stands. 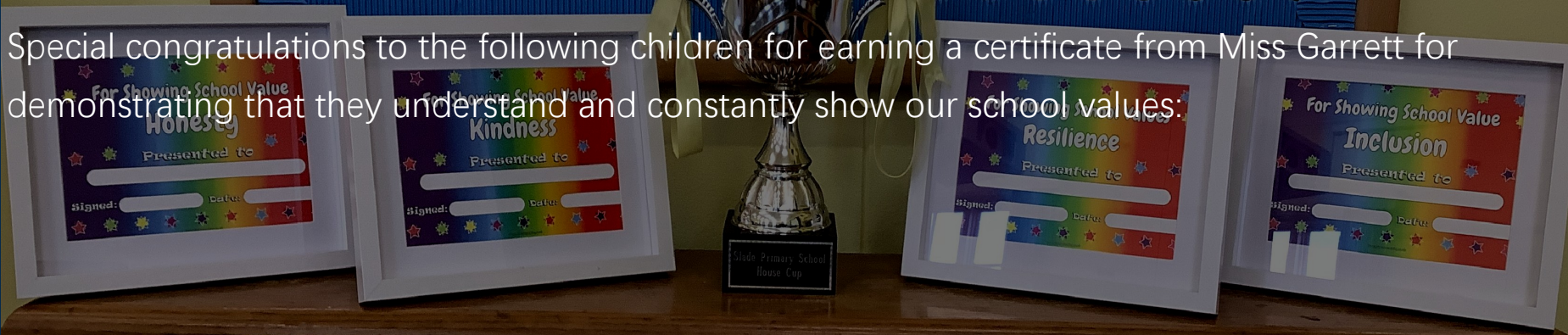
