Dear Parents and Families,

We've had a lovely week in school, with the sunshine allowing even more learning to take place outdoors. Several year groups have also been out in the community with Year 2 visiting the Tonbridge Mosque as part of their RE learning, helping to deepen their understanding of this term's topic.

Meanwhile, Year 5 had a fantastic trip to Carroty Wood, where they took part in activities such as climbing, swimming and the low ropes. Mr Duffin was incredibly impressed with the teamwork and encouragement for each other that the children showed throughout the day. A shining example of this was the challenge to lift the tyre over the pole - this team showed perseverance and became the first group that Mr Duffin has ever seen complete the task. Well done! From the photographs, it certainly looks like they all had a brilliant time! It won't be long before Year 6 head off on their residential trip to PGL in Ashford. Mrs Stephens is currently finalising the plans, and a video for parents will be shared with you soon.



Speaking of videos, I will shortly be sending an updated video for Year 5 parents, providing more detailed information about the secondary school application process, including the Kent Test (11+). I am just waiting for the final key dates from KCC before sharing this with you.

Monday was particularly exciting, as many of us saw the new building for the first time. It was lovely to hear the children's reactions as they arrived with one pupil even commenting on how hard the builders must have worked over the weekend! Mrs Westwood (School Business Manager) and I met with KCC and the project team yesterday, and I'm pleased to report that everything is progressing well and remains on track.

On Wednesday, we welcomed Gemma Willson, a Local Authority Safeguarding Advisor, into school. We had commissioned a safeguarding review to evaluate our current systems, celebrate what is working well and identify next steps. Gemma met with Mrs Stephens (our Designated Safeguarding Lead), myself, a range of staff and pupils, and also observed daily school life. I'm pleased to share that it was a very positive visit, with safeguarding continuing to be a strong aspect of our school.

That brings us to the end of the second week of Term 5 and a slightly longer weekend due to the Bank Holiday on Monday. Fingers crossed the sunny weather continues and not the weather that is forecasted (!) and that you are able to enjoy some time outdoors.

I look forward to seeing you all next week, when we will already be halfway through the term!

THE BUILDING HAS LANDED!

Last Saturday was a momentous day in the history of Slade Primary School as Vic and his team from Integra Buildings saw in the delivery of our newest building on schedule and successfully planted in position between the Adventure Playground and the current Hippogriff Classroom.

Thankyou to the parents who contacted us at the beginning of the week who were viewing the exciting delivery either from their own homes, or as they were coming into the area for their own weekend activities - the project remains as planned and we are very pleased with progress so far, with Business Manager Jill Westwood commenting, 'We are very pleased with the progress of the new fully accessible classroom and care unit. With the groundworks now complete and the unit successfully winched into place last weekend, the project has moved into its next phase.'



That next phase started this week when we have been joined on site by electricians from IDH Alarms and from Trustee Fire and Security to fit the intruder and fire alarm systems to the building which still has a bit of work to be completed before it is ready to be used.

Jill told us what comes next: 'First-fix works are already underway, including the installation of electrical, fire and security systems, and the majority of the remaining work will now take place internally as we move towards handover. I would like to reassure parents and carers that the site continues to be securely managed at all times, with safety remaining a top priority.'



Slade Primary School and Integra Buildings are grateful for the positive feedback given by our parent community for the work done and for their professionalism shown in engaging with parents and neighbours about the project and for keeping disruption to a minimum. YEAR 2 VISIT TONBRIDGE MOSQUE

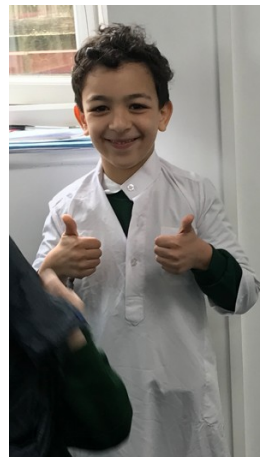
Following the recent Year 1 visit to the Parish Church last term, our RE learning was back on the road this week as the Year 2 classes visited the local masjid - a mosque and place of worship for people of Muslim faith, where prayers are held and community events held.

Gnome Class visited on Tuesday and Mrs Manktelow let us know what the children had been up to:

'We were met by Hilal, who is the Imam at the Mosque. Hilal spoke about the importance of prayer to those who follow Islam and why prayer happens at certain times of day. He also explained that a Muslim would face towards the Kaaba in Mecca when praying and why this was.

The children had the chance to try on some traditional Muslim dress and went on a hunt around the building to see what they could find, building on the knowledge already learnt in their RE lessons. They were able to identify different features of a Mosque especially the prayer mats and the Muslim holy book, the Qur'an. Imam Hilal set the children a challenge of translating a word from the Arabic in the Qur'an into English - they successfully translated it to be 'Ramadan' the very special time of year for all Muslims.'

We would like to thank Hilal and all of the team at the Mosque for his hospitality and for helping the children expand their learning and understanding by seeing the objects that they had learnt about. Our thanks also to the parents who took time to walk with us, making the visits possible.

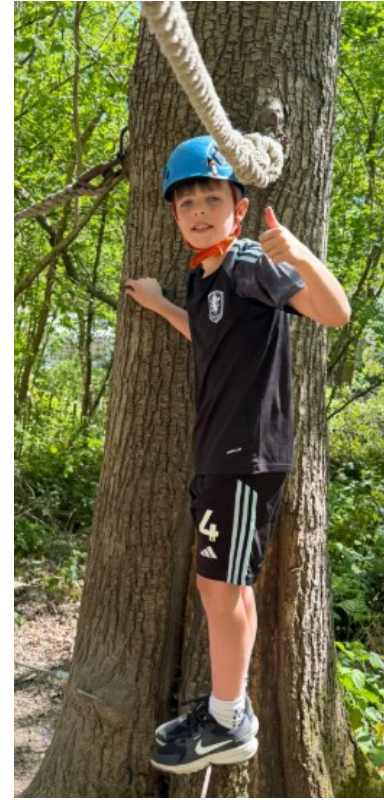


YEAR 5 ACTIVITY DAY AT CARROTY WOOD

SAFETY OUTSIDE OF THE HOME

This week's Safeguarding Hot Topic: Safety Outside the Home

As the days grow longer and children spend more time outdoors, this week's safeguarding focus is on staying safe beyond the home. Whether walking to school, playing with friends, or travelling around Tonbridge, it's important that children understand how to keep themselves safe.

Road safety reminders

Please take time to reinforce key road safety messages with your child:

- Always stop, look, and listen before crossing the road
- Use designated crossings where possible (zebra, pelican, or lollipop crossings)
- Avoid distractions such as mobile devices when near roads
- Make sure children know the importance of wearing seatbelts and using appropriate car seats

Safe walking routes to school If your child walks to school, it's helpful to:

- Plan and practise a safe, familiar route together
- Encourage walking with friends or siblings where possible
- Identify safe places along the route (e.g. shops, school, or known community spots)
- Remind children to stay alert and avoid shortcuts through isolated areas

Stranger awareness and "safe adults" Helping children understand who to trust is a key part of keeping them safe:

- Teach children that a stranger is anyone they do not know well, not just someone who looks unfamiliar
- Remind them never to go anywhere with someone they don't know, even if asked for help
- Discuss who their "safe adults" are (e.g. parents, carers, teachers, other family members)
- Encourage children to trust their instincts and speak up if something doesn't feel right

Top tip for families

Create a simple "what if" plan with your child. For example: What if you get lost? What if someone approaches you? Practising responses can help children feel more confident and prepared.

By working together and having regular conversations, we can help children develop the confidence and awareness they need to stay safe in the wider community.

SLADE AT THE TCS MINI MARATHON

What a wonderful experience it was for our mini marathon runners last Saturday as they trod the path that the following day would see the fastest ever Marathon finish - that of Sabastian Sawe, the Kenyan who ran the 26+ mile course in 1 hour, 59 Minutes and 30 seconds! Our young and aspiring athletes had the treat of running along the lasty stretches of the course and across the finish line of one of the world's most famous races.

Slade were one of the very lucky schools nationwide who won a place to participate in this year's Mini Marathon - an annual event where schools are invited to run a one mile or a 2.6km route that took in some of the most iconic sites of the capital city with their start line on Horse Guards Parade, past Buckingham Palace and along The Mall to the finish line.

Entertainment was provided for the traditional warm up exercises which took place in the Horse Guards Parade - home of the famous Trooping of the Colour ceremony before taking to the road track for the run. Participants were cheered on by crowds from around the world and took home with them a very special TCS London Marathon medal, their own timed result and a bottle of water from sponsors, Buxton. Miss Garrett and Mrs Stephens ran with the children alongside Fitness and Wellbeing Champion Wendy Ball and all agreed it was a very exciting and special event to be part of. Parents and other members of staff were supporting the Slade runners throughout and we thank everyone who went along, ran or shared these photographs as a memory of the day.

I'm very grateful to have had the opportunity to be a part of it and really hope it might inspire others in some way too.'
