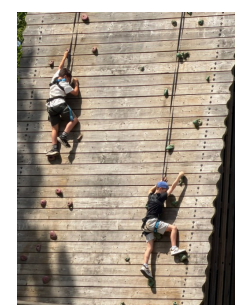


YEAR 6 RESIDENTIAL ACTIVITY WEEK

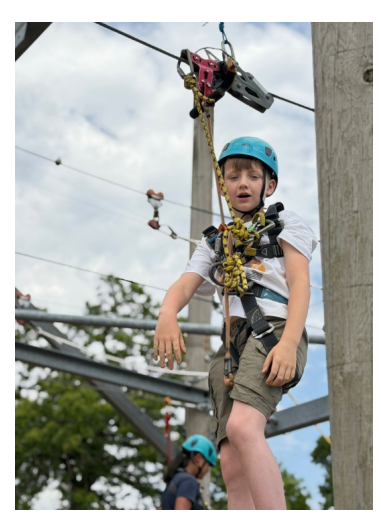
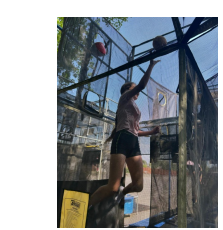
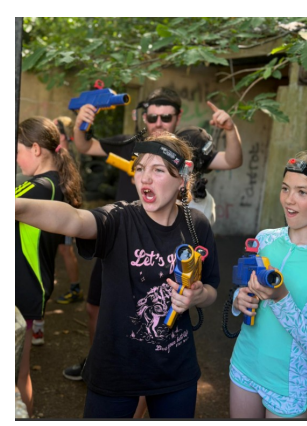
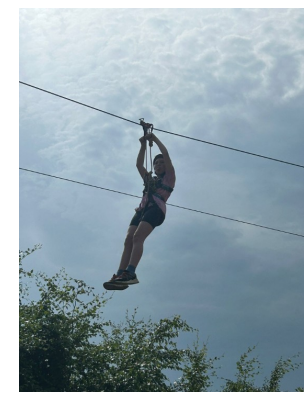

SUPPORTING CHILDREN THROUGH TRANSITION AND CHANGE



Designated Safeguarding Lead, Mrs Stephens.

As we approach the end of the school year, many children are preparing for changes such as moving into a new class, meeting a new teacher, or, for our Year 6 pupils, starting secondary school. While these milestones are exciting, they can also bring feelings of uncertainty or worry. Change is a normal part of life, and with the right support, children can learn to approach new experiences with confidence and resilience.

How You Can Support Your Child:

Talk Positively About the Change

Encourage your child to share how they are feeling. They may be excited, nervous, or even have mixed emotions. Reassure them that these feelings are completely normal and remind them of times they have **successfully managed change before**.

Focus on the Positives

Talk about the opportunities ahead, such as making new friends, learning new subjects, taking on new responsibilities, or enjoying different experiences. Helping children look forward to these opportunities can build excitement and confidence.

Keep Routines Consistent

During periods of change, familiar routines provide children with a sense of security. Maintaining regular bedtimes, mealtimes and family routines can help reduce anxiety.

Encourage Independence

Support your child to take responsibility for simple tasks such as organising their school bag, choosing their uniform or preparing for the school day. Small responsibilities help children feel confident and capable as they move into their next year group.

Read and Talk Together

Books and stories about starting something new can help children understand that change is something everyone experiences. Talking about characters' feelings can also help children express their own emotions.

Signs Your Child May Need Extra Support

Some children may need additional reassurance during times of transition. Look out for:

- Changes in mood or behaviour.
- Difficulty sleeping.
- Increased worries or clinginess.
- Reluctance to talk about school.
- Complaints of headaches or tummy aches without a medical cause.

If you notice these signs, offer plenty of reassurance and encourage open conversations. If you have ongoing concerns, please speak to your child's class teacher. We are here to support every child through this important stage.

Looking Ahead

Over the coming weeks, children will have opportunities to meet their new teachers, visit their new classrooms and take part in transition activities. These experiences are carefully planned to help everyone feel settled and ready for the new academic year.

Family Challenge of the Week

Ask your child to write or draw three things they are looking forward to next year and one thing they are a little worried about. Spend some time talking together about how you can make those worries feel smaller and celebrate the exciting opportunities ahead.

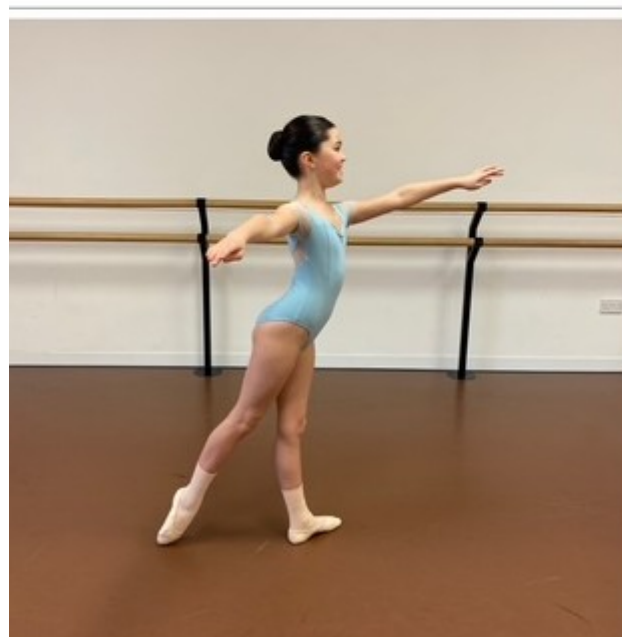

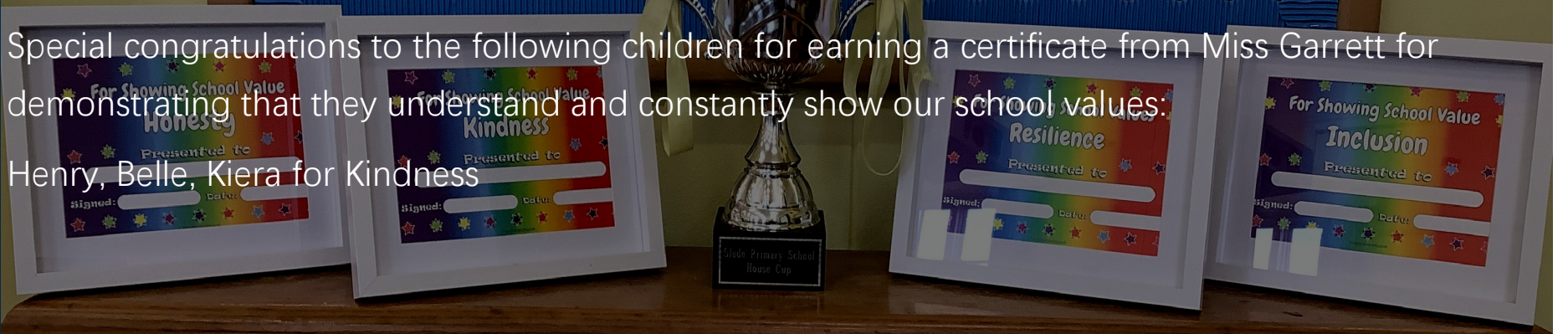
