## YEAR 6 ACCOUNT BALANCES: A MESSAGE FROM JILL



Business Manager Jill Westwood has a special message for families of children currently in Year 6.

Jill says: 'As our Year 6 pupils prepare for their final day at school next Friday, we would like to remind families to check their meal and wraparound care accounts and ensure any outstanding balances are cleared before the end of the academic year.'

Where accounts are in credit, the following arrangements will apply:

### Meal and Wraparound Accounts (Breakfast Club/After School Club paid by card)

- If your child has a sibling remaining at the school, any credit balance will be transferred to the sibling's meal account at the end of the academic year.
- ◊ **Exception:** *If the sibling receives **Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM)** and therefore does not require a meal account balance, any credit of £5 or more will be refunded to the payment card originally used.*
- If your child does not have a sibling remaining at the school, any credit balance of £5 or more will be refunded to the payment card originally used.
- Credit balances of less than £5 will be treated as a donation to the school unless we are informed otherwise by 23:59 on Friday 17 July.

### Wraparound Accounts Funded Using Childcare Vouchers

If applicable, families will be contacted individually regarding any remaining balances.

**If your account is in arrears, it is important that the outstanding balance is cleared as soon as possible.**

## TAKE PART IN THE BIG FUTURE

The Children's Commissioner, Dame Rachel de Souza, has a statutory and independent role to promote and protect the rights of children, and to make sure that their voices are heard by those who make decisions about their lives.

To help her do this, Dame Rachel has launched her biggest survey yet. The Big Future is open to all children in England and asks about childhood today. About the things that worry them, the things they love, the ways they have fun, and the changes they want for a better future. At a time when there is a mood of doubt across Westminster and the nation at large about how we raise our children today – from screentime to schooling, from future jobs to AI – we will be granting many of those same children the right to vote for the first time. Yet, children consistently say they're not heard and excluded from the debate. That's why The Big Future will offer a new and comprehensive look at what children have to say about childhood today, and what they think needs to change for a better future.

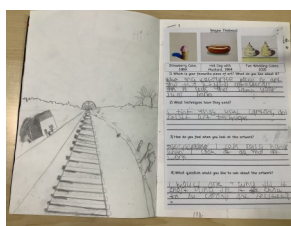
## OPEN EVENING

# FIRST AID AWARENESS FOR CHILDREN



## Designated Safeguarding Lead, Mrs Stephens.

Teaching children basic first aid skills helps them feel confident, responsible and prepared to respond calmly in an emergency. While children should never be expected to deal with serious injuries on their own, learning simple first aid knowledge can help them keep themselves and others safe.

What Children Can Learn:

### How to Get Help

#### Ensure your child knows:

- Their full name and home address.
- How to call 999 in an emergency.
- When it is appropriate to call for emergency help.
- **How to explain what has happened and where they are.**

Recognising an emergency

#### Talk about situations where an adult should be told immediately, such as:

- Someone is unconscious.
- A person is struggling to breathe.
- There is heavy bleeding.
- Someone has been seriously hurt.

Remind children that their first job is always to find a trusted adult if one is nearby.

### Simple First Aid Skills

#### Children can learn how to:

- Wash small cuts and grazes with clean water.
- Apply a plaster with an adult's help.
- Wash their hands before and after treating a minor injury.
- Stay calm and reassure someone while waiting for help.

### Staying Safe

Explain that children should never put themselves in danger to help someone else. It is always safer to call for an adult first and follow instructions.

### Practise at Home

#### You can help your child by:

- Showing them where your first aid kit is kept.
- Talking through what they would do in different situations.
- Teaching them how to dial 999 and what information they may be asked for.
- Encouraging them to remain calm and seek help from a trusted adult.

### Family Challenge of the Week

Together, find your family's first aid kit and check that it is well stocked. Talk about what each item is used for and discuss who your child could ask for help if someone was injured at home, at school or while out and about.
