Dear Parents and Families,

At the start of the week, I held an extraordinary assembly for the whole school to announce our House Captains and Sports Captains for this academic year. With the sun shining, we were able to bring everyone together briefly on the playground so that the whole school could hear the announcements following the elections which took place on Friday. I would like to say a huge well done to everyone who put themselves forward for the role of House Captain. It takes a great deal of confidence and bravery to stand up and put yourself forward, and I was incredibly proud of all those who did so. I look forward to working closely with our newly appointed representatives over the coming year and seeing them develop their leadership skills and make a positive contribution to school life.

We will shortly be holding our Pupil Council elections, giving our children another opportunity to experience democracy in action and to have their voices heard. This year, the Pupil Council will be led by Mr Clark, and we will be tweaking a few things about how it operates to ensure that children gain valuable experience of leadership, representation and decision-making. We also want to make sure that the work of the Pupil Council is closely aligned with what matters to our children, alongside our own school priorities. We want our pupils to understand that their views really do matter and that they can play an active role in helping to shape our school. As part of strengthening the link between pupil voice and school governance, Pupil Council minutes will also shortly become part of the agenda for our Governing Body meetings. This will ensure that our governors have a regular opportunity to hear directly about the issues and priorities that are important to our pupils. On Wednesday, we were pleased to welcome Siobhan Price, Assistant Director for School Inclusion at Kent County Council, to Slade. Mrs Barber, our Inclusion Leader, and I spent time showing Siobhan around the school and discussing our approach to inclusion, including the work we are doing to ensure that all children can access the right support and provision through our universal, targeted and specialist offer. We also had the opportunity to discuss the direction of travel for inclusion across Kent, particularly in light of the changes ahead and the ongoing work around SEND provision and funding, whilst recognising the financial constraints schools are currently facing. It was a really useful opportunity to share what we are doing at Slade, to hear KCC's perspective and to consider how we can continue to strengthen our inclusive practice. We know that there are significant changes ahead for SEND provision across Kent, and we will continue to keep our school community informed as these develop.

Alongside our extraordinary assembly on Monday, Mrs Parker led our first ever Play Assembly as part of our OPAL project! The assembly provided an initial introduction to OPAL for the children and helped us to establish some of the important expectations we need to remember when we are out at playtimes and lunchtimes. Our three key messages are:

- **Look after ourselves.**
- **Look after each other.**
- **Look after our play equipment.**

Mrs Parker also shared information about some of the exciting new play zones that will be introduced later next week. The children discussed the rules and expectations that we need to have in place to make sure that everyone can enjoy these new areas safely. Play assemblies will now form part of our regular assembly schedule as we continue to develop OPAL across the school. We are really excited about the opportunities this will provide for our children to develop their independence, creativity, collaboration and problem-solving skills through play. Finally, during our Meet the Team meetings this year, we reminded parents about the importance of making sure that school is kept up to date with any allergies your child may have. As you may be aware, new statutory requirements around allergy safety have come into effect in England from September 2026, often referred to as Benedict's Law. These strengthen expectations around allergy awareness, staff training, policies and emergency arrangements in schools.

I am pleased to say that Slade has been ahead of the curve in many of these areas. Our staff undertook initial allergy awareness training around two years ago, we have held an Allergy Awareness Week, we already have an emergency adrenaline auto-injector available in school and we have an allergy awareness policy in place. All staff have also been asked to renew their allergy awareness training this September to ensure that everyone remains up to date with the latest requirements. However, one of the most important parts of keeping children safe is making sure that we have accurate and up-to-date information about individual allergies. If your child has an allergy, it is therefore really important that you inform the school so that we can ensure the appropriate measures are in place and that staff have the information they need. Flu Immunisation at Slade

Every child at Slade is invited to have the annual Childhood Flu vaccination in school when the NHS Community Health team visit on Monday 12 October.

The NHS have contacted us to say that only 50% of families have completed the required form which needs to be submitted regardless of giving consent to have the vaccination, or if you are saying that you would not like the vaccination administered at school. Choose a school

It's important to find out more about the schools you are interested in before you decide to name them on the application form.

Read the Guide to Secondary admissions at www.kent.gov.uk/secondaryadmissions.

You can name up to four Secondary schools, inside or outside of Kent, but you must name them all on the same application.

Apply for a school place

A simple, fast, convenient process which opens Tuesday 1 September 2026 and closes at midnight on Monday 2 November 2026. Other LA deadlines may differ.

If you already have an account set up from the Kent Test process, please use these login details.

You will receive an email confirmation that your application has been submitted correctly and that the LA has received it.

You can log back in at any time to view the information submitted.

Receiving your offer

On offer day (Monday 1 March 2027) an email will be sent to you informing you of your offer.

You must accept or decline the school place you have been offered by Monday 15 March 2027. A link to a guide with information you will need to provide the school with will be in your offer email.

If we have not offered your child a place in your preferred school, you have the right to appeal. You can also add their name to the school's waiting list if your child is eligible for admission.

Moving house during the application window will likely complicate your application and we therefore advise you to pay special attention to key dates in the admissions process. KCC has no discretionary authority to vary the process for parents who cannot complete address moves in time to make use of them for admissions purposes. If you are moving, please email the team on one of the email addresses below for advice.

Monday 2 nd November 2026	Online application process closes for the main round. Any amendments after this date must be emailed to kentonlinedadmissions@kent.gov.uk
Monday 1 st March 2027	Offers of school places sent to parents via email after 4pm.
Monday 15 th March 2027	Parents should contact the school to accept/refuse the place that has been offered and can use the link in the offer email to ask for their child to be added to the waiting list of eligible schools named on the original application.
Tuesday 13 th April 2027	Appeals need to be lodged by this date to be heard before September - appeals information can be found at www.kent.gov.uk/schoolappeals . You can only appeal for schools that were named on the application form.

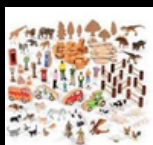
Only one application per pupil will be accepted. If you apply online, do not complete any other form of application. Keep your login details safe and use your registered email address for all communication with the team.

The confirmation email may go to your junk/spam folder of your email - please check here before contacting our team for confirmation.

Please note applications can only be made via Kent County Council (KCC) if the child resides at a KCC address. If your child does not reside at a KCC address, you must make an application via your Local Authority.

In addition to these fun objects, we are asking if anyone has any large cardboard boxes free that you wouldn't mind donating to school, Mrs Parker will be using them during some different activities next week - they can be brought round to the school office, given to the class teacher or left with the donation bins at the entry and exit gates. At Slade, we want every child to feel safe, ready to learn and proud of the choices they make. Our new traffic light system was launched this term with the aim to help children understand the behaviour expected and how adults will respond. How the traffic light system works:

GREEN	Showing our school values Kindness, honesty and care for others; listening, sharing, following instructions, moving safely and trying our best in learning.
YELLOW	A reminder and an in-class response For behaviour such as calling out, distracting others or unkind comments, an adult will remind the child of green behaviours. They may change seat or group, have thinking time, or miss some supervised play or lunchtime.
AMBER	Further support and a reflection If behaviour continues or seriously disrupts learning, the child will complete a reflection sheet and speak with a phase leader. Parents will be informed.
RED	Senior leader response For serious incidents, such as fighting, abusive language or unsafe behaviour, a senior leader will decide the appropriate response and contact parents.

Celebrating green behaviours

When a child shows green behaviours, they earn a punch on their reward card. Once the card is full, they choose from the reward menu below. After three completed cards, they can choose a special reward from Miss Garrett.

Children can choose:

- Sit with a friend
- Be the teacher’s helper
- Choose a class story
- Extra time in the reading corner
- Help an adult in a different class
- Sit on a special cushion or chair
- Bring a teddy for the afternoon
- Show and Tell pass
- Wear a special badge
- Line leader
- Choose a class game or activity
- Lunch with the teacher



Adults will use professional judgement and make appropriate adaptations for individual children.

Working in partnership with parents is an important part of helping children understand our expectations and make positive choices. We hope this new system will give children, staff and families a shared understanding of how positive behaviour is recognised and how we respond when things go wrong.

If you have any questions about the system or how it applies to your child, please contact your child’s class teacher in the first instance.

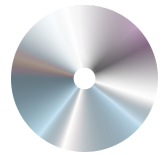
