Dear Parents and Carers

As mentioned in last week's newsletter we would very much like for you to see first-hand what a typical morning in school entails and familiarise yourselves some of the children's learning experiences. Therefore, we will be holding this year's Open Mornings on Wednesday 29 January and Tuesday 4 February between 9a.m. and 11a.m. These mornings will be an opportunity for you to hear from the Senior Leadership Team and Chair of Governors as we share with you the main priorities for the school, including our long-term strategic plan, and discuss the main features of our School Development Plan. The presentation will begin at 9.15 in the main school hall and last for approximately 45 minutes, still allowing plenty of time for you to wander and explore the learning not just in your child's class but in all classes across the school. In order to help us plan and prepare for this event an online booking system has been set up, with spaces limited to two per family, and will be open from 6pm Monday evening. Please be aware that the first part of the morning is an information sharing session and may not be suitable for pre-school aged children. Rock Solid Crew

The Year 3 Classes got together on Wednesday afternoon to produce the now annual festival of musical learning known as their Rock Concert.

Over 80 parents, carers and friends were here to enjoy the gig, performed in the main hall.

The children have been listening and appraising a number of classic rock songs from the last seven decades.

The concert started off with the whole cohort performing the iconic rock anthem <u>We Will Rock You</u>. The show continued with a selection of hits that had been adapted with their own lyrics, performed by groups of children who had also given themselves a band name - look out for these names in the future: **The Raptors** (who belted out their version of <u>Uptown Girl</u>, called Kids from Slade) and **The Wolves** (20th Century Wolves based on <u>20th Century Boy</u> by T-Rex).

Other groups gave us their versions of <u>Seven Nation Army</u> by The White Stripes (adapted to Hippogriff Rock), <u>Shotgun</u> by George Ezra (adapted to Rockstar), <u>Gold on the Celling</u> by The Black Keys (adapted to Gold out of the Window), <u>Old Town Road</u> Lil Naz X (adapted to Common Room) and Eye of the Winner (based on <u>Eye of the Tiger</u> by Survivor). The assembled crowd were also treated to some original compositions such as Lets Party by Spencer's group, Rock the Stars by Elysia's group and I'm Rockin' the World by Lucius' group.

The concert was rounded off with the two classes coming together again to perform their finale: <u>Rockin'</u> <u>all over the World</u> by Status Quo.

The children are all very proud of their learning and their concert and would like to thank all of the parents who supported them as well as Mr Louth, Mrs Stephens and Mrs Luffingham for getting them ready to perform through their music lessons this year so far.

We are all incredibly proud of our Friday afternoon enrichment sessions which take place after the Celebration Assembly at the end of the week.

The children from Years 1 to 6 all choose from a variety of activities which they will join in for the term. This will involve learning and developing a skill or interest and means working with a different teacher and mixture of age groups from across the school.



This term, Mr Watts' activity is Sports Journalism. The group will be producing a magazine showcasing the numerous sports that the children have the opportunity to take part in at Slade, whether that be through their regular PE lessons, special sessions brought in by the West Kent Sports Partnership or at events and competitions held locally.

They will be writing, editing and producing articles, the style of which you would recognise from established professional magazine titles.

The group were especially lucky this afternoon to have met and heard from one of the busiest and best in the business, award winning journalist Ben Watts - who happens to also be our own Mr Watts' cousin!

Ben will be well known by listeners to BBC Radio Kent for his sports bulletins, feature programmes and for being the voice behind live commentaries of Gillingham FC in League 1 during the football season and of Kent Cricket through the summer.

Ben also works for the official <u>UEFA website</u> by updating uefa.com with Champions League news and latest scores on matchdays.

The enrichment group heard from Ben about all of the different aspects of his job, not just the 'on air' part and the pathway he took from primary school to become a journalist and radio presenter and commentator. He described what kind of preparation goes in to each broadcast and the equipment that is involved in a broadcast, whether in studio or outside.

We are all very grateful for Ben taking the time to visit the group this afternoon and for the advice that he has been able to pass on to a group of our children that have a genuine interest and ambition in his area of work.
