Dear Parents and Carers,

We're half way through Term 3 already and it's been another busy week of learning for children and staff alike! Do ask your children what exciting things have been happening in their class this week!

I am delighted to share that Fiona Toft, currently a Teaching Assistant providing one to one support in Pegasus Class, has been successfully appointed to the role of Finance Officer, following the departure of Anel Andrews at the end of Term 2. We look forward to welcoming Fiona into the office team and now having her with us in school on a daily basis as she continues with some of her Teaching Assistant hours too. Congratulations Fiona!

We are currently advertising three support staff vacancies that have become available, 2 of which are new roles, working in our Inclusion Team under the leadership of Catherine Barber our Inclusion Leader. In addition to our upcoming Open Mornings, the first of which is next week, we will also be holding 2 curriculum information sessions for parents focusing on 'Calculation in Maths'. This is an opportunity for you to find out more about how we teach calculation in Maths across the school, enabling you to then support your child using the same methods in their learning at home. The session will explain the main points in our calculation policy with some of our older children demonstrating the methods to you. There will hopefully be time for you to enjoy doing some calculations yourselves too! These sessions will be held on Tuesday 25 February at 9am and then repeated at 2.45pm. Both sessions will be held in the main hall and last for approximately 45 minutes. We look forward to seeing you there.

If you have any concerns or queries about your child in school then please do arrange a time to discuss these with your child's class teacher. This can be done by catching the teacher at the end of the day, once the class has been dismissed, telephoning the school office to arrange an appointment at a mutually convenient time or by emailing the class teacher at the class email address. Don't forget that we will be holding parent consultation meetings in Terms 4, which will be an opportunity for you to discuss your child's progress to date with the class teacher and find out what their targets are for the term.

A reminder of our expectations with regard to school uniform; all of our children are expected to wear regulation school uniform to school every day. This includes black school shoes; trainers are not permitted unless in exceptional circumstances following a discussion with either myself or Miss Garrett. Hair should be a natural colour and tied up if longer than collar length. Any hair accessories should be discreet, not brightly coloured and jewelry should not be worn with the exception of small studded earrings which should be removed for PE lessons. Thank you for your help and support in reinforcing these regulations with your children.

Mouths Wide Open

Our KS2 children were treated to a visit from Kelly and Ellen from Stradbrook Dental Clinic who are visiting local primary schools talking about good dental hygiene.



The children were given information about what makes a healthy mouth with healthy teeth and how good eating and brushing help to maintain healthy teeth and gums.




They were shown how to brush properly and effectively as well as finding out what causes decay. Kelly (shown below demonstrating to Griffin Class) and Ellen (left) were keen to stress that children are allowed sweet treats, but they must remember to brush thoroughly afterwards.

All of the children were given a gift bag to take home which included a free Wisdom Step by Step toothbrush with gum bumpers and tongue cleaner and a leaflet for parents and carers about taking the children to the dentist, how best to clean teeth, the causes of toothache and decay prevention.

Stradbrook are offering free check ups for all children (-18 years) and have appointments available during the February break (between Monday 17 and Friday 21 February) and after school times from 16:00. Just contact their reception team on 01732 385242 or [book via their website](#).

Our older children all enjoyed the visit - if you don't usually have the opportunity to visit the dentist for check-ups, please try to do so, either at Stradbrook or any of the local dentists in town, many of who offer NHS appointments.

Helping with History

We have been contacted by a local historian who is assisting with research in to a teacher who would have taught at the 'National School' or 'Bank Street Boys School' in Tonbridge towards the end of the Victorian era in 1895 - 1900.

The teacher, Mr Harry J Payne (pictured left) sadly died in conflict and is listed in the Roll of Honour for the Fallen of World War 1 at his teacher training college, King Alfred's in Winchester.



King Alfred's, now the University of Winchester, are carrying out this research and are keen to track down the school, or schools, that Mr Payne worked in, as it would complete the last piece in his story,

The story of Tonbridge's Harry Payne sits alongside other poignant memories of former students at King Alfred's Winchester Training College who fell in WWI on a dedicated website in their honour; take a look at <https://wtcfallen.com/> for sight of these stories.

Headlice and Threadworm

There have been a few reported instances of headlice and threadworm here at the school this week. Both of these bugs are common in children and are harmless, albeit a nuisance!



Headlice

We advise that pupils are checked on a weekly basis to prevent any outbreak of lice spreading. Further information on headlice can be found from the [NHS here](#), or by consulting a pharmacist.

Threadworm

Threadworms live in the bowel and the bottom, they are white worms about 15mm long that look like threads of cotton.

The most common sign is scratching around the bottom, especially at night which may cause disturbed sleep, although some children will show no symptoms at all. You may see the threadworm in the child's stools and around their bottom region.

There is no need to keep your child off of school as long as they are treated and good preventative hygiene advice is being followed such as : Keeping nails short, not biting or sucking fingers, bathing daily especially in the morning and using separate towels to the rest of the family. Washing hands after visiting the toilet and before eating as well as cleaning the toilet seat regularly.

Urgent messages can also be sent via SMS. Please make sure we have an up-to-date mobile telephone number. We use Teachers to Parents SMS.




