<u>Term 4 Learning at Slade</u>

If your child is in Year 2-6, today they should have brought home a letter with their personal login details for 'Times Tables Rockstars'.

'Times Tables Rockstars' is a fun, multi-award winning online programme that can be used on a laptop or through the app on a tablet or mobile phone that gives children a carefully sequenced programme of daily times tables practice.

Children get the opportunity to earn coins where they can buy costumes and accessories for their rock star avatar and can also challenge and compete against their friends.

Please take the time to introduce your child to Times Tables Rockstars at home as regular practice has proven to have a really positive impact on the progress of recalling these important facts.

If you have any questions or comments regarding 'Times Tables Rockstars', please email the school office and these will be addressed by the class teacher or Maths lead, Mrs Stephens.

Ciarán and Emily who are at two local schools have been taking part in TimesTables Rockstars. Emily, from Sussex Road School said, 'Yes, I do my Timestables Rockstars in school, I really enjoy it, particularly being able to design my own character.' Ciarán (below), who is at Barming School in Maidstone, agreed, 'Everyone in my class enjoys this. It's like doing times tables for a reason because you can earn coins to dress your character and get to move up the league table!'





Term 4 Topics

Year R - 'Are We There Yet?' We will be reading Going on a Bear Hunt, The Three Little Pigs and The Train Ride, to find out about different journeys, types of transport and animals. We're Going on a Bear Hunt

Year 1 - 'What Does it Take to be a Great Explorer?' We will be learning about Ralph Fiennes, Amy Johnson, Christopher Columbus and Neil Armstrong. We will also be looking at instructions and the importance of them being clear and unambiguous. This will result in us becoming TV chefs!





Year 2 - 'Welcome Aboard the Titanic.' Continuing to build on our topics from this term.

Year 3 - 'Tonbridge' We will be carrying out a local study of Tonbridge and thinking how and why our local area is changing.

Year 4- 'Norman Castles' We find out why castles were important to the Normans. This topic will be enhanced by a visit to Tonbridge Castle.

Year 5 - 'The British Empire' We look at why Britain had ambitions to expand an empire across the globe and seek to find out the reasons behind the demise of Britain's influence in the world.

Year 6- 'Ancient Egypt' The Year 6 children will be investigating a big question on the subject of Ancient Egypt.



Parliamentary Prize

Earlier today we were privileged to welcome Tom Tugendhat MP to Slade. Tom has been Member of Parliament for Tonbridge and Malling since 2015 and runs an annual competition in Term 2 for children to design a Christmas Card. The winning design is used by Tom when sending his seasonal best wishes in the local constituency.

Out of respect for the parliamentary situation in early to mid December, Tom postponed the announcement of the winners, one of which was Amelia in Hippogriff Class. Amelia was surprised and delighted in equal measure by Tom's visit, made over lunchtime today.

Once he had completed this formal part of his visit, Tom enjoyed a Nourish lunch and was then kind enough to spend some time with the Pupil Council, who had prepared some questions for him.

Tom was asked what he was most passionate about at the moment, he replied that he is determined to see action on Tony's Law (KM story here).

He was questioned about his political ambitions, his answer was honest, stating that he would love to become Defence Secretary (Tom was in the Army and describes this time in his life as a great adventure, working with a great team), but he was not completely in line with the Prime Minister at present, and therefore he has more freedom to try and drive change in his current role.

He repeated that he voted to Remain in the EU Referendum in 2016 and that the best way to change things positively was to co-operate fully and closely with our neighbours.

One answer stood out from the rest, as Tom explained how we could all make out of life what **we** wanted. He said: 'You can choose who you are, you decide who you want to be, it is up to you as you are in charge of your life, not your parents, not your teachers.'






This reply was inspirational for the pupil council members who, along with Miss Lidlow and Mrs Slade, were incredibly grateful to Tom for giving up his time spending time with the children, who he said asked great questions - indeed it is harder in these groups as children are far more unpredictable in their line of questioning - 'You can normally predict the questions adults will ask, not so with children!'

Finally, in case you are wondering, Tom's favourite Pizza Express pizza is the spicy option, on the Romana Base!


