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Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back! I hope that you all had a super half term break and are looking forward to everything that we have planned for Term 4.

Many thanks to those parents who attended our Maths curriculum information sessions on Tuesday this week. This was an opportunity for those who attended to find out more about how we teach calculation in Maths across the school, enabling you to support your child using the same methods in their learning at home. Thank you to those of you who have taken the time to provide us with feedback and to tell us how informative you found the meetings including how much you enjoyed the practical element of the sessions! Special thanks to Mrs Stephens for planning and leading the presentation and to Siwon, James, Jing-Wen and Emily for confidently demonstrating the methods we use to the captive audience. Well done Year 6! You will have received a copy of the slides from the session and the handout that we shared via ParentMail on Wednesday.

This week we have been holding Pupil Progress meetings where members of the school leadership team meet with each class teacher and their support staff to discuss the progress of each child in school. It has been pleasing to see the progress that your children have made since these meetings were last held in Term 2. A reminder that Parent Consultation meetings take place at the end of this term on Tuesday 25 and Wednesday 24 March. This is an opportunity for you to meet with your child's class teacher to discuss the progress they are making and to hear of their targets for the coming terms. The booking system for these meetings will be opening on Thursday at 7pm. We look forward to seeing you there.

I am sure that you are all aware of the occurrence of the Covid-19 virus (coronavirus) and the subsequent confirmed cases in the UK. This week we have discussed with all the children the steps that they can all take to prevent the spread of infection, including the importance of regular handwashing especially when having been to the toilet. We would ask that you reinforce these messages with your children at home as we work together in the interests of the health and safety of all our pupils and staff. Secondary School Offer Day

Year 6 parents, carers and children will be eagerly awaiting National Offer Day for places at Secondary School from September.

You will be emailed from Kent County Council from 16:00 on Monday.

With your offer letter which states which school you have been allocated, you will also receive an Acceptance and Refusal Form. This form should be returned to the school that has been offered before Monday 16 March. When accepting a place you should note the list of documents that should be taken with you to prove identity.

Also in your pack will be a Waiting List Form. This form should be used if you wish to be placed on to the waiting list of any school that you named in the original submission process. You can do this online via the <u>KCC Website</u>.

Around School

<u>Maureen's Memories</u>

On Tuesday we were delighted to meet Maureen Davis, who popped in to Slade to see the memorial board to those former pupils who gained distinction in WW1.

It was an emotional and poignant visit for Maureen as two of her relatives, both uncles, appear on the board having served in that conflict. Everyone at Slade is incredibly proud of our history within the community of Tonbridge and it is always fascinating to hear from or about people who have been part of that history - in this case Herbert and William Seale.





Local historian Pam Mills, who accompanied Maureen takes up the story:

William Henry Seale was born in Tonbridge in 1891, the son of William and Ann. In 1901, the family lived at 2 Peach Hall and William was a pupil at Slade School. By the time of the 1911 census, William had already enlisted in the 1st Battalion Royal West Kent Regiment and was stationed at the Quebec Barracks, Bordon in Hampshire. In 1915 he married Bridget in Tonbridge having first been sent to France on 15 August 1914. He was a good soldier and had been promoted to Sergeant by 1917. He then obtained a commission in the 2nd Battalion Oxford and Bucks Light Infantry. He was attached to the 5th Trench Mortar Battery. In 1918 he won the Military Cross for valour in the field. He was home on leave between 19 February and 6 March 1918 and on returning to France was immediately back in action. He was severely wounded in action on 8 March and subsequently died of his wounds on the 14 March 1918. He is buried at Rocquigny-Equantcourt Road British Cemetery in Étricourt-Manancourt.

Herbert Seale, usually known as Bert, was William's brother and also attended Slade School, was 19 years old and a Lance-Corporal in a trench mortar section of the Cyclists, attached to the Royal West Kent Regiment. In 1915 he won the Distinguished Conduct Medal. The citation for the award reads: *For conspicuous gallantry and determination on October 13th near Hulloch's Quarries. He was buried as a result of explosion of shell and after extracting himself, he returned to his trench mortar and although suffering from severe shock and total deafness he worked it with great coolness under heavy shell firing all afternoon.*

Herbert Seale survived the war and was discharged to Class 'Z' Army Reserve on 5 March 1919.

With nearly 300 pages of researched information including of the regiments that were based in the town during WW1, with descriptions of the activities and training along with photographs.


In the absence of any war diary kept by home county regiments this book highlights how Tonbridge took on the appearance of a Garrison town during WW1 and shows how the soldiers spent their time. This book will prove useful to all ages. The second half of the book is dedicated to the fallen from Tonbridge as this list is not available in any purchasable format.
