












Around School

A quick reminder that for your child to be enrolled in to either the Breakfast or After School Club you should have handed back the Registration Form to the School Office. This provides the staff in the facility easy access to the emergency details and allergy information in case of need.

Recently, we have had an increase of parents wishing to cancel sessions on the day. The Terms and Conditions agreement states that cancellations can only be made up to 24 hours before an After School session and 48 hours before a booked Breakfast Club slot. The same timescales operate when booking at home, although we can make ad-hoc emergency bookings via the school office during the day as long as the signed agreement form has been submitted.


